THE PRESENT STATUS OF *EPHEMERELLA UENOI*  
(EPHEMEROPTERA: EPHEMERELLIDAE)

*Ephemerella uenoi* Allen & Edmunds was described but not named by Ueno (1953) from a single nymph collected by the Japanese Himalayan Expedition in Nepal in 1952. Allen & Edmunds (1963) named this mayfly from Ueno's description and figure, and placed the species in the subgenus *Drunella* Needham.

Allen, in 1971, erected the subgenus *Acerella* for *Ephemerella longicaudata* Ueno, 1928, and three other previously undescribed species, including *Ephemerella undatella*. The name and description of *E. undatella* Allen was based, inadvertently, on the same specimen as was *E. uenoi* Allen & Edmunds. *Ephemerella undatella* is a synonym of *E. uenoi*, and *E. uenoi* is transferred to the subgenus *Acerella*.
